FEMA Releases 2014-2018 Strategic Plan New Plan Establishes Agency's Road Forward

FEMA releases its <u>2014-2018 FEMA Strategic Plan</u>, on <u>July 15th</u>. The strategic plan was developed through the involvement of hundreds of FEMA employees and many external stakeholders who contributed to generating our objectives, strategies and outcomes. The plan advances the agency's mission and reflects objectives we, as an agency, will accomplish to provide the best possible support to the American people before, during and after disasters.

For 2014 to 2018, FEMA will focus on five strategic priorities, institutionalizing key improvements made over the last four years while building agency capacity and strengthening national capabilities for disaster preparedness. The five priorities will spur cross-agency collaboration, guide allocation of resources and inform how all FEMA employees approach their work. These efforts will further integrate two strategic imperatives into the agency's programs and operations: a whole community approach to emergency management and a culture that fosters innovation and learning.

FEMA Announces Membership of Technical Mapping Advisory Council (TMAC)

FEMA is announcing the membership of the Technical Mapping Advisory Council (TMAC).

The TMAC is being established as mandated by the Biggert-Waters Flood Insurance Reform Act of 2012, and further expanded by the Homeowner Flood Insurance Affordability Act of 2014, to develop recommendations on FEMA's flood mapping program and to ensure that Flood Insurance Rate Maps reflect the best available science and are based on the best available methodologies for considering the impact of future development on flood risk.

The national flood mapping program provides flood maps to inform communities about the local flood risk and help set minimum floodplain standards so communities may build safely and resiliently. The Flood Insurance Rate Maps established under the program are used to set flood insurance premiums.

"The experts selected to serve on the Technical Mapping Advisory Council represent a broad range of engineering and mapping disciplines," said David Miller, FEMA's associate administrator for the Federal Insurance and Mitigation Administration (FIMA). "Their extensive knowledge and diverse points of view will be great assets as they make recommendations for the national flood mapping program and how we continue to map using technically credible and scientific practices in identifying flood risk."

Seeking Input on Tribal Declarations Pilot Guidance

In January 2013, the Sandy Recovery Improvement Act (SRIA) provided federally recognized Indian tribal governments (tribal governments) the option to request a Presidential emergency or major disaster declaration independently of a state. To implement this historic provision, FEMA initiated a second round of consultation on the working draft of the Tribal Declarations Pilot Guidance with tribal governments, conducting working meetings across the country to collect comments and feedback from tribal governments.

Members were selected based on specific, congressionally mandated membership guidelines to ensure that a variety of stakeholder perspectives are reflected in the deliberations and recommendations. The legislation requires the appointment of members from 16 specific member categories to ensure a significant cross section of technical expertise. These categories include a geographically diverse group of federal, state and local agencies, and various categories of private sector associations and organizations that deal with flood-related issues.

In addition to the expertise of Council members, FEMA recognizes that specific Subject Matter Experts will be a critical component of the Council's work and will be selected to assist the TMAC membership. Subject Matter Experts will include tribal officials, climate science experts, flood control experts from states with high concentrations of flood insurance policyholders, and other expertise the Council concludes is not fully represented within the Council's membership categories.

The TMAC intends to hold six meetings during the first year; three virtual, and three in-person meetings. Members serve either one to two year terms, at the discretion of the Administrator, to refresh and ensure the expert input required to produce the specific recommendations and reports required.

FEMA released the Fiscal Year (FY) 2014 Funding Opportunity Announcement for the Continuing Training Grant (CTG) program totaling \$11 million. The CTG helps strengthen national preparedness and provides training to assist first responders, homeland security/emergency management officials and citizens to prepare for all types of disasters.

The highly competitive FY 2014 CTG program grants will be awarded to state and local (including rural) communities, tribes, nonprofit national associations and organizations, and nonprofit higher education institutions. The grant awards will be announced by the end of FY 2014. Applications for the FY 2014 CTG program are found at www.grants.gov.
